- One of the epitome achievement is Boger's General Analysis. This was used as the basis of Boger's Card Index Repertory. There are 6 editions of Card Repertory and the latest 6th edition is present in Zomeo Homeopathic software under Complete Repertory.

BASIS OF GENERAL ANALYSIS IN CARD REPERTORY

- Based on Boenninghausen's concept of grand generalization, this concise repertory by Boger is limited to about 450 rubrics. He defined it as a complete symptom consist of location, sensation, modality and concomitant which is one grand symptom. The rubrics in General Analysis as the title suggests are limited to generals than particulars or specifics. They are pertain to the locations according to the anatomical sphere where the symptoms arise.
- It is a hidden gem of homeopathy by Boger who compiled to be useful for complex, chronic cases. The long-standing chronic diseases lack characteristic symptoms or are mingled, confusing. In such cases, General Analysis repertory comes handy due to the concept of generalisation and the characteristics of the remedies.

SYMPTOM CLASSIFICATION

- Fundamental/Constitutional
- Present display or outbursts of acute deeper lying tendencies
- Modalities

Classification of cards

- Cards related to Locations
- Cards related to Sensations
- Cards related to Modality
- Cards related to Pathological rubrics
- The cards related to locations, sensations and modalities have been broadly classified to necessitate compactness. The cards related to pathological rubrics are similar to that found in Synoptic Key and Boenninghausen's Characteristics and Repertory.

- **Examples:**

Location – Epigastrium (Card no- 91)

Sensation- Adhesive (Card no -1)

Modalities – Dampness (Card no- 60)

Pathological – Emaciation (Card no – 88)

Structure of card repertory

- The card repertory is a distillation of Boenninghausen's method.
- The original version of the card repertory had one card for each symptom.
- Each remedy with that symptom had a hole punch in the card.

Repertorization

- To do a repertorization, you take the cards covering the symptoms of the illness, lined them up, and look for the holes that went through all the cards.
- Thus it was an eliminative repertorization.
- A remedy had to be present in all the symptoms to show up in the results.
- This script has the same symptoms and remedies as Boger's, but instead of doing an eliminative repertorization, it counts how many times each remedy occurs in the symptoms and displays the remedies occurring in the most symptoms.
